

EAGLE TECHNOLOGIES EXPANSION

Eagle Technologies plans to create 100 additional jobs by 2024. Due to the large increase, Eagle Technologies has expanded its operations into a new space in St. Joseph. It recently passed the \$100M revenue milestone, an achievement owned largely to an investment over the last decade into electric vehicle (EV) technology. Eagle Technology will use 80,000 square feet of leased space on Kerth Street, which is owned by Clark Logic, for their expansion.









CHI ISHOBAK, INC. PARTNERS WITH WBC TO ASSIST TRIBAL ENTREPRENEURS

The Women's Business Center (WBC) at Cornerstone Alliance is partnering with Chi Ishobak, Inc., to support native entrepreneurs by providing technical assistance that will enable them to secure much needed capital to start and grow their businesses. This partnership acts as a referral program, sending Tribal Citizens to the WBC to prepare them with necessary business materials prior to requesting a loan. The WBC will provide one-on-one business counseling to assist aspiring entrepreneurs with business plan creation and more, at no cost.

LAKESHORE DIE CAST RECEIVES INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES TAX EXEMPTION

Cornerstone Alliance received approval on behalf of Lakeshore Die Cast of an Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption from the Village of Baroda Village Council. The upgrade will support the connection of a 1.4MW AC grid tied solar array which will generate 100% of the power used on-site for the production of die castings. The project will retain 28 jobs, add eight new jobs, and create over \$725,000 in capital investment. The upgrade will allow Lakeshore Die Cast to utilize all 14 die casting machines on-site simultaneously and still have additional power to add more die casting and machining capability.

CORNERSTONE ALLIANCE INFLUENCESPOLICY IN SUPPORT OF NEW JOBS

Cornerstone Alliance President, Rob Cleveland, joined State Rep. Pauline Wendzel to testify on June 8, 2022. Cleveland spoke in support of two bills authored by Wendzel that will help Michigan create jobs and attract more economic development projects by becoming more competitive with surrounding states. House Bills 5768 and 5769 provide local governments and their economic development partners more flexibility with current tools they already have in their toolbox.

WOMEN'S BUSINESS CENTER NAMED MICHIGAN'S 2022 WBC OF THE YEAR

The Women's Business Center (WBC) at Cornerstone Alliance was recognized as the 2022 WBC of the Year in the state of Michigan by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). In 2021, the WBC helped launch 19 new small businesses, supported 192 jobs, and helped clients secure capital investments of \$5.5 million in Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren counties. Additionally, the WBC counseled and trained 1,062 unique clients, and launched a re-brand initiative to improve its service.

On July 29, Cornerstone Alliance hosted a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the grand opening and relocation of JOANN Fabric and Craft Stores to 1800 M-139. In April 2021, Cornerstone Alliance approached Benton Charter Township



with the request of a rehabilitation exemption for the building. The request was approved, allowing Jim Paul of JPA Real Estate, to redevelop the 1960's building to attract new tenants.

BERRIEN COUNTY RECEIVES \$2.6 MILLION IN RAP FUNDING

On Sept. 7, the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) announced Berrien County will receive \$2.6 million to make significant local improvements in Benton Harbor and Niles. The limited eligible uses for the RAP (Revitalization and Placemaking) funds means projects in Benton Harbor could include housing units, as well as amenities that will draw more people to downtown Benton Harbor and the Arts District. Cornerstone Alliance partnered with Berrien County to submit the fund application for Benton Harbor and Niles.
